

\*\*\* FURTHER \*\*\* INSTRUCTIONS FOR WINNING TEAMS

\* Welcome Desk. The phone numbers of the airport desk are: +41 22 717 78 40 and +41 22 717 78 41.

For those arriving by train from Germany or Switzerland, get off at the Geneva Airport (last stop, after Geneva Corvanin stop) and join the LitU welcome desk located in front of the arrivals. People arriving from France: your train will stop in Geneva Cornavin railway station. Therefore the best thing to do is to take the BUS 9 direction CERN (not ZIMEYSA) and get out at the last stop. CERN and LitU reception is located hundred meters backwards. Detailed information on how to get to CERN is available on:

\* Tutor. Each delegation will be welcomed and supported by at least one tutor chosen amongst CERN scientists. Tutors will be available also during the fair on Thursday and for the visit and webcast on Saturday afternoon. The ten finalists will be able to rely on the tutor's support for preparing their presentation.

\* Youth Hostels. We are trying to arrange things (rooms allocation) to best suit all participants (young competitors, teachers and NSC). The final room allocation will be communicated at your arrival.

\* Passport. Upon your arrival at CERN all participants will be given the conference bag containing a "passport" where all useful information is collected: a detailed programme of the event, practical information about CERN, BUS timetable, location of rooms and different places, as well as the tickets for lunches and the dinner on Nov 7.

\* Stands. Stands, one per country, will be attributed by us according to the number of projects. In total there will be 8 stands 2 metre wide, 17 stands 3 metre wide, 4 stands 4 meter wide, all are 1 metre deep. Each booth will be lit and contain two electrical points at ground level, it will be equipped with a PC, connected to the Internet. Therefore participants don't need to bring their own laptop.

\* Webcast. The live Webcast will take place on Saturday 10 at 7 pm. It is possible to interact live with the show via the Internet. Everybody will be able to send questions via e-mail during several question times. We invite you to follow the webcast if you are not coming, and in any case to spread the information as much as you can.
